What do you want to know about the MSU Police Station? You can find the information about the Police Station here!

“Where is the MSU police station located?”

The main police station is located in Butler Guest Housing. There are three police substations located on campus at #34 Aiken Village (Phn. 662-325-3939), Hathorn Hall (Phn. 662-325-9510), and Hurst Hall (Phn. 662-325-4139).

“What do they do for the students?”

The police officers are keeping the students safe. They arrest criminals, make sure there are no drugs or alcohol on campus, and enforce traffic laws. They patrol every day, and they make sure dangerous things will not happen. It's very good for students!

“What time does the main station open and close?”

It is open 24 hours every day. They work very hard to protect the students.

“How many police officers are on campus?”

There are 16 police officers on campus. In total, 37 people work on in the police stations. The MSU police officers must have 400 hours of training at a police academy and a 12-week campus training course.

“Who is the police chief?”

It's a woman police chief! Georgia Lindley is the police chief of the MSU police department. Kenneth Spencer is the assistant chief.
